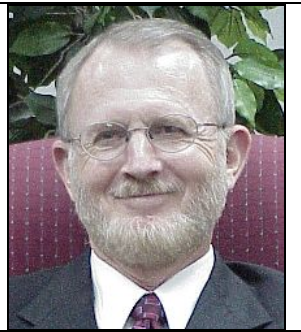

Jesse Jones currently serves as President of the North Texas Community College Consortium. Since 1992, he has worked with leaders of the twenty-five member colleges and the University of North Texas to develop the Consortium into a model for regional professional development, institutional research, and overall "communication, cooperation, and collaboration" (the Consortium's motto).

As an administrator in both two-year and four-year institutions, Jesse has served with distinction as Division Chairperson, Assistant Dean, Vice President, and Interim President.

As a college English professor, he taught courses from the developmental to the graduate level. He has received campus teaching awards and has been nominated for statewide teaching awards. He has twice been the recipient of summer scholarships from the National Endowment for the Humanities for advanced studies in literature at the University of California at Berkeley and at Emory University.

He has also served as Visiting Lecturer for the Community College Leadership Program at the University of Texas at Austin; for the Higher Education Program at the University of North Texas; and for the Higher Education Program at Texas A&M--Commerce.

He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree (with honors) with a major in English and minors in Latin and History; a Master of Arts degree with a major in English and a minor in History; and a Ph.D. in English with a major in British Literature 1837-Present and a minor in American Literature to 1865.
