<sup>1</sup> UNT applicants should take entrance exams at least two months before admission deadline date. See high school counselor for information. The SAT I score requirements shown above reflect the April 1, 1995, recentering of the SAT I by The College Board. For students who may have taken the SAT I prior to April 1, 1995, the pre-recentered SAT I equivalent scores are shown in parentheses.

<sup>2</sup> The State of Texas requires, through the Texas Academic Skills Program (TASP), that all undergraduate students take a test over reading, writing and mathematical skills prior to accumulating nine or more semester hours of college-level credit at Texas public institutions. Failure to take the TASP test will limit the student to taking noncredit remedial classes as required by state law. For additional TASP information, call the UNT TASP Office at (940) 565-4403. The TASP test cannot be used in admissions decisions at UNT, but is necessary for adequate preregistration advising.

<sup>3</sup> A **transient student** is an undergraduate student (U.S. citizen only) who enrolls at UNT for one long semester only (fall or spring). A **summer visiting student** is an undergraduate student (U.S. citizen only) who enrolls at UNT for either or both summer terms with the intent of returning to the home institution upon completion of summer studies. To remain at UNT after the first semester, a transient student must meet all normal admission requirements. Because of federal laws and immigration requirements, international students are not eligible to enroll at UNT as transient students.

<sup>4</sup> A former student is one who has not attended UNT during at least one of the last four consecutive semesters immediately preceding the intended semester of enrollment. Continuing students (those enrolled at UNT during one of the past four consecutive semesters) are not required to reapply. Students who have taken correspondence or extension courses must reapply for admission as former students.
