[Annie's Homegrown: Environmental Studies Scholarships](#)

Purpose: Annual scholarship program to support graduate and undergraduate students in environmental studies.

Field of Study: Environmental sciences and related fields.

Eligibility: Registered students. No citizenship requirement.

Award: \$1,000 scholarships are awarded to 25 students each year. The award is to be used for tuition, fees, books, and other education-related expenses.

Deadline: No deadline, applications are accepted year-around.

Application: Applicants are notified of awards within two months of applying.

[Asian Cultural Council \(ACC\): ACC Fellowship](#)

Purpose: Annual award to support cultural exchange between Asia and the U.S. in the performing and visual arts, primarily by funding students from Asia for study, research, travel, and creative work in the U.S.

Field of Study: Visual and performing arts

Eligibility: East and Southeast Asian artists, scholars, students, and specialists for work in the U.S. Some fellowships are awarded to Americans for similar work in Asia.

Award: Fellowships are awarded for periods up to twelve months in duration, providing round-trip international air transportation, per diem, domestic travel, maintenance, medical insurance allowances, and some educational expenses.

Deadline: February 1

Application: February 1 is the primary application deadline; some applications may be accepted August 1. Purpose: Annual fellowships to encourage individuals seeking to improve their knowledge or skills while looking for solutions to current problems in Atlantic salmon biology, management, or conservation.

Field of Study: Salmon biology, management and conservation.

Eligibility: Legal residents of U.S. or Canada, tenable at any accredited university or research laboratory, or in an active management program. Not required to be enrolled in graduate program.

Award: \$1,000-\$3,000

Deadline: March 15

Field of Study: Composition

Eligibility: Citizens of the Western Hemisphere (North, Central and South American and Caribbean nations) who were under 26 on December 31.

[Elizabeth Greenshields Foundation: Grants for Art Students](#)

Purpose: Annual award made to art students, artists, and sculptors who need further training or other assistance during the early stage of their career. The Foundation seeks to promote an appreciation of the traditional expression in painting, drawing, sculpture, and the other graphic arts.

Field of Study: Fine arts, including painting, drawing, printmaking, and sculpture. Artists working in abstract and non-representational art are not eligible.

Eligibility: Students registered currently or graduated recently from an established school of art. Individuals who can demonstrate, through past work and future plans, a commitment to make art a lifetime career are also eligible. There is no citizenship requirement.

Award: A stipend of \$12,500 (Canadian) is paid directly to the student.

Deadline: There is no application deadline; applications are accepted throughout the year.

[Haestad Methods: Engineering Scholarship Program](#)

Purpose: Annual scholarship to assist engineering students from around the world in pursuing an education in engineering.

Field of Study: Engineering fields with an interest in water resources.

Eligibility: The scholarship recipient is selected based on the quality of the applicant's and/or team's paper relating to water resources. The paper must incorporate the use of a Haestad Methods software product in some aspect of the project. Eligible applicants must be enrolled in a full-time engineering program at an accredited university or college, have a minimum GPA of 3.0 out of 4.0 or equivalent, and have an interest in water resources.

Award: \$2500 (US) cash scholarship upon completion of the required paper. If applying for the scholarship as a team, the scholarship award will be evenly divided among the contributing team members.

[Herbert Scoville Jr. Peace Fellowship](#)

Purpose: Annual program to provide an opportunity for college graduates to gain practical experience by contributing to the efforts of non-profit, public-interest organizations in the Washington, D.C. area working on peace and security issues.

Field of Study: Government, international relations, conflict resolution, peace studies, and related fields. Of special relevance are arms control, disarmament, conflict prevention and resolution, defense budget, dismantling chemical and nuclear weapons in

the former Soviet Union, economic conversion, environmental security, export controls, and international security.

Eligibility: Individuals who have received a bachelor's degree. There is no citizenship requirement. Applicants are expected to demonstrate an excellent academic background and a strong interest in issues of peace and security. Graduate study, a college major, course work, or substantial independent reading that reflects the substantive focus of the fellowship is advantageous; prior experience with public-interest activism or advocacy is desirable.

Award: A stipend of \$1,800 per month, health insurance coverage, plus travel expenses to Washington, D.C. Tenure of award is 6 to 9 months.

Deadline: October 15 for fellowships beginning in spring; February 1 for fellowships beginning in fall.

[Institute for Humane Studies: Humane Studies Fellowships](#)

Purpose: Annual award to support the work of outstanding graduate and undergraduate students who are interested in studying the classical liberal/libertarian tradition of individual rights and dignity; protection of rights by institutions of private property, contract, and the rule of law; and voluntarism in all human relations, including the unhampered market mechanism in economic affairs, with the goals of free trade, free migration, and peace.

Field of Study: Humane studies and research that deals with the moral and economic choices involved in human affairs.

Eligibility: Graduate students and junior and senior undergraduates who are registered for full-time study. Fellowships are awarded generally to applicants studying in the U.S., Canada, and the U.K., but applications from students in other countries are considered.

Award: Up to \$12,000 for one year. Fellows are eligible to reapply in subsequent years.

Deadline: December 31

Purpose: Annual scholarship program to support undergraduate students attending community colleges or two-year institutions who are planning to transfer to four-year institutions.

Field of Study: Any.

Eligibility: Students attending community colleges or other two year institutions in the United States. No citizenship requirement.

Award: The amount and duration of awards vary by student based on the cost of attendance and the length of the program as well as other scholarships or grants received. The maximum available per student is \$30,000 per year.

Deadline: February 1

Field of Study: Open to all fields.

Eligibility: A student currently enrolled in a full-time undergraduate or graduate program is qualified to apply for the KASF scholarship.

Award: Not specified.

Deadline: June 4

Application: The scholarship recipient is selected on the basis of financial need, academic achievement, school activities, and community services. Purpose: Annual program to strengthen the role of women from developing countries.

Field of Study: Open. Grants have been made to women in such fields as agriculture, architecture, urban planning, civil engineering, education, nursing, nutrition, pediatrics, public administration, public health, sociology, and social work.

Eligibility: Must be a female national of a developing country enrolled in an accredited educational institution in the U.S. 2. Must be interested in issues that relate to women and/or children and be planning on returning to her country within two years of the date on which the grant is made 3. Must demonstrate financial need 4. Must not be related to a World Bank staff member or spouse

Award: Grants up to \$6,000.

Deadline: January 15

Application: Application materials must be requested before January 15; completed applications must be submitted no later than February 1.

[National Inventors Hall of Fame: Collegiate Inventors Competition](#)

Purpose: Annual program to encourage college students active in science, engineering, mathematics, technology, and creative invention by providing cash awards and recognition for extraordinary achievement.

Field of Study: Open to all fields.

Eligibility: Applicants must have been registered as full-time students for all or part of the prior 12 months, either as graduate or undergraduate students. There are no citizenship or residency restrictions. Teams of up to 4 individuals may apply. Winners are required to attend the award ceremony in September.

Award: Each winning student or team receives \$20,000 and a \$2,000 gift certificate to Hewlett-Packard. The winner's academic advisor receives \$10,000.

Deadline: May 31

Eligibility: Undergraduate and graduate students.

Award: Stipend based on research area(s) and academic classification. Time ranges from one month to one year.

[Rotary Foundation of Rotary International: Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarships](#)

Purpose: Annual program to further international understanding, world peace, and friendly relations among people of different countries. Ambassadorial scholarships are of three types: academic-year, multi-year, and cultural.

Field of Study: Open to individuals in all fields of study.

Eligibility: An applicant, normally, must have completed at least two years of undergraduate course work and must be a citizen of a country in which there is a Rotary club. Applicants should be proficient in the language of the intended host country; they are expected to be outstanding ambassadors of goodwill to the people of the host country.

Award: For the academic-year scholarship, a stipend of \$13,000 to 25,000, depending on institutional expenses. See web site for further information.

Deadline: Deadlines vary from club to club, but are normally between March 1 and July 15.

[Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute \(STRI\) \(Smithsonian Institution\): Short-term Fellowships](#)

Purpose: Annual award to support short-term research projects in the Republic of Panama in fields relevant to the STRI mission. STRI promotes greater public understanding and awareness of the importance and fragility of tropical flora, fauna, and cultures.

Field of Study: Tropical biology, ecology, behavior, and evolution of terrestrial and marine plants and animals.

Eligibility: Graduate students proposing a research project, either exploratory or complete in itself, in Panama under the supervision of the STRI staff. Awards are sometimes made to undergraduates and postdoctoral scholars.

Award: A stipend of \$750 per month for 3 months, a modest research allowance, and round-trip airfare. Fellows are housed in STRI facilities. Extensions of the research period are awarded only in exceptional circumstances.

Deadline: February 15, May 15, August 15, & November 15.
