**Coca-Cola Two-Year College Scholarships** The Coca-Cola Scholars Program scholarship is a merit-based scholarship awarded to 250 high school seniors each year. Fifty of these are four-year \$20,000 scholarships (\$5,000 per year for four years), while 200 are designated as four-year \$10,000 scholarships (\$2,500 per year for four years).
