ABSTRACT

Abstracts are intended to give enough information to your reader, so they can determine if they want to continue reading. This means that your abstract should not be too long. Typically, an abstract should be around 200–300 words, and they should not exceed more than one page.

Due to the online Vireo submission, it is not necessary or required to include this abstract page within your document as the Reader will be able to create the abstract page for you within the final PDF. However, if you would like to include the abstract within the document, it should follow the formatting on this page.

Note: There is no heading or page number on this page, and the abstract doesn't appear in the Table of Contents. Despite it being the first, the page number must be ii

CHAPTER 1

TITLE

In the Multi-Article format, students can include articles that have been published or are under consideration for publication alongside standard, unsubmitted chapters. Students should follow the publisher's guidelines for content (i.e., style guide); however, the article must follow UNT formatting, such as margins, spacing, and page numbers.

The decision to follow the Multi-Article format, as well as the number of articles to include, should be confirmed with your committee. Always double check the publisher's guidelines for what permissions may be needed; what can or cannot be included within the thesis/dissertation; and whether or not the publisher requires an embargo. UNT does not allow for a permanent embargo, so we ask that students avoid publishing arrangements that would require a permanent embargo on the thesis/dissertation.
